The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper

As we get more accustomed to living with the risk of the COVID-19 pandemic, mitigated by the effectiveness of vaccines and boosters, we regain more of our customs and practices. This includes how Christ meets us in the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. At the beginning of the pandemic, when we returned to worship, we used the individually wrapped packages. We then moved to using individual plastic cups each Sunday. There are cost and environmental concerns with using so much plastic. In consultation with the Worship and Music Board, we have decided to return to intinction as our customary communion practice.

Intinction means the first server will hand you bread, and the second server will hold a chalice for you to dip the bread before placing it in your mouth. For those who are not comfortable with that practice, we will have the individually wrapped packets available for you at the communion stations. You also may receive the bread only. On the first Sunday of each month, we will return to kneeling and receive individual cups of wine.

Thank you for your patience and prayers! God continues to be faithful and bring healing and restoration to us.

Imagine: A Vision of Hope

We are so grateful for your faithful response to our capital campaign. We received pledges of over \$850,000 to pay off our mortgage once and for all! Thank you. The council voted to keep one year of mortgage payments in reserve, but to use all of the rest of your designated capital campaign gifts to pay down the principle. We will celebrate milestones along the way as we get closer to finishing off our payments.

Meet and Eat



Council Corner

Highlights from the Monthly Council Mtg.



Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **December 20.** Meeting minutes with details will be posted at www.blcmankato.org and also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

<u>Financial Report</u>: Continued Good News!! The November 30 general fund balance is a positive \$9,000+ with prospects for finishing 2022 with a positive balance. <u>Thank you!</u>

<u>Capital Campaign</u>: \$850,000+ received in commitments thus far from BLC members for payoff of \$1 million mortgage balance. Members may still submit pledges on the BLC website and with written pledge forms to the church office. Contact Molly Nelson with questions & assistance.

Mortgage Payment Plan: Action approved to maintain a 1-year balance of \$8,187 monthly mortgage payments in the Mission Investment Fund with all additional capital campaign contributions to be applied in a timely manner to mortgage principal payments. Plan to celebrate mortgage payoff benchmarks during the next 3 years.

Financial Reviews: 2021 financial review completed with written report to be submitted. Plans being made for 2022 review by Financial Secretary & 3-member Financial Review Committee.

Refugee/Asylum Seeker Resettlement: Bethlehem is working with 4 other local churches to host individuals & families seeking to resettle in the U.S. as refugees and asylum seekers. First effort began this month by providing emergency assistance to a family of 4 from Nicaragua. Stay tuned for more details. Financial assistance is needed for gift cards, transportation & cash-paying jobs. Contact Pr. Jacie for more details and how you can help!

2022-26 BLC Strategic Plan: 5 goals and 37 supporting objectives & practices have been finalized for implementation by BLC members & staff. These will be posted on the BLC website for member review. Learn and get involved to move us forward as a congregation and make a real impact with our members and in our community.

<u>Pastor Jacie & BLC Youth</u>: Pr. Jacie is moving into her new ministry at BLC by meeting with the Youth Board to pursue our 1st strategic goal of better engaging our youth, their families and youth adults. Expect to hear more about this new initiative in our new 5-year strategic plan.



May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. ~ Romans 15:13

I believe this is a good text entering into the New Year. God's will is for us to have peace, joy, and hope. Something may happen in 2023 that is not joyful. In a world that is out of sync with the perfect will of God, things may happen that are not in God's perfect will. When these things happen, pray to God, and ask that God's will be done. It may feel strange, but when you are angry, forgive God. It was not God's perfect will that Jesus should die on the cross, but God had an answer, which was the resurrection. God has a resurrection for us, too. "...Abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." We cannot believe in the resurrection on our own. The Holy Spirit helps us to believe. After 28 years of dealing with ALS, some days I have no belief. Perhaps you have had similar experiences. The Holy Spirit helps us to believe in the face of a situation that sometimes feels hopeless. What has helped me is to worship the risen Christ. When the risen Christ is proclaimed, the Holy Spirit helps us to believe. C.S. Lewis said that the Christian's trouble in this life is that we do not think of the life awaiting us. We have a great life awaiting us. God's will is that we have joy, peace, and hope in 2023.
