Meals will be served daily from 5:45-7:30 p.m. Grocery donations will be needed for our weeks, and a wish list will be sent out the weekend before the week starts. Notes from the Community & Global Missions Board



Bethlehem's October Monthly Mission is the ECHO Food Shelf. ECHO has been an important part of the Mankato area and surrounding communities since 1981, when a group of concerned people recognized a crisis in the community and organized the collection of food in a church basement. The need for services has increased, and

ECHO has expanded to meet the growing needs of our community. Volunteers bring food to local families who are unable to get to the food shelf, and the summer feeding program fills the meal gap with many families. Several volunteer positions are available for those who are interested in helping ECHO with their program. We have set a monetary donation goal of \$3,000. We thank Bethlehem members for their commitment to our community.

Highlights from the Monthly Council Meeting

Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **September 20**. Meeting minutes with details to be posted at www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

New Associate Pastor News: Pr. Jacie Richmond has officially joined Bethlehem as our new associate pastor. Her first Sunday with us will be on October 23 to meet BLC members. Her official installation will take place on Sunday, December 4 during worship with a reception to follow in Grounds for Joy.

<u>Financial Report</u>: August 31 deficit is -\$39,834.95 compared to July 31 deficit of -\$28,459.21. Expenses are normal but planned member giving continues to lag. Actual member giving is at 83% of what was budgeted since January 1. **Mortgage** balance is \$1,029,555 with monthly payments of \$8,187 to cover principal & interest. Funding available for 15 months resulting from continued member contributions.

Endowment News: Board is preparing new plan for future investment & distribution of funds. Attend November 6 adult forum to learn more & meet board members.

<u>New Strategic Plan</u>: 5 major goals & background information now posted on BLC website. Specific objectives being completed to measure progress in meeting goals during next 4 years.

<u>Capital Campaign</u>: All is on schedule for launch of campaign on 9/25. Plan on attending major congregational dinner on Sunday, October 23. Stay tuned for more details!

<u>Lead Pastor Performance Review</u>: Annual review conducted on 9/19 with Pr. Jay and Council leadership team. Very positive review approved by Council.

2023 Lay Staff & Pastoral Compensation: 2023 recommendations forwarded to Finance Committee for October 5 annual budget setting meeting.

<u>Fall Semi-Annual Meeting</u>: Save the date on **Sunday**, **November 20** for semi-annual meeting.

Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, October 18.


Notes from Elizabeth Ruiz, Financial Secretary


