

#### An Update on the Cruz Family

The Cruz family continues to do very well! The family recently had an opportunity to go out to Wisconsin to visit some other family members who are in the United States. The WELCOME team also heard from the law office that asylum paperwork was officially filed at the beginning of October. At this point, it is just a waiting game until we hear about what next steps are. We were also told that work permits can be applied for 150 days after the asylum application is received. This would be sometime in March 2024 at the earliest. If the family is granted asylum, they will be eligible for residency/green cards 1 year after asylum is granted. So, in other words, it is a long process and we are very much still in the beginning stages. We continue pressing forward, though.

The fiesta for the family was a huge success! Thank you to all who were able to attend! We have been hearing a lot of feedback about how it was nice to get all 5 churches together to celebrate. We had approximately 200 people from all 5 congregations attend the celebration. It was a fantastic evening to celebrate all the ways that God has been among us all in this process!



Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on November 21. Official minutes with more details are posted at www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Finances: The monthly deficit declined from -\$62,076.01 on September 30 to -\$31,786.86 on October 31. Increased giving and fewer major expenses contributed to this financial improvement. The goal is to further reduce this deficit in November/December for a positive end-of-year balance. Members are encouraged to fulfill their 2023 financial commitments to make this a reality.

Stewardship: As of November 12, a total of 165 financial pledges representing \$371,289 have been received for 2024. This reflects a 3.64% increase totaling \$13,046 more in member commitments. Thank-you notes have been mailed and reminders will be sent to other members with hopes of additional pledges to meet planned 2024 expenses.

Financial Review Report: A standardized financial review report form was approved to assess the annual financial operations of the church by the Financial Review Committee.

Pastoral Housing: Specific tax designations of pastoral salaries for housing expenses approved.

November 19 Semi-Annual Meeting: A positive fall semi-annual meeting was held on 11/19 with 98 members in attendance approving the 2024 church budget. Budget, along with the annual goals for the Council, boards & committees and the strategic plan, are available on the church website.

Iambi Secondary School: Over \$10,000 in funds received for school scholarships.

WELCOME: 200 members of 5 churches attended community celebration of Cruz family on 11/9. Asylum paperwork officially filed with extended timeline expected for approval & work permits. Strategic Goal 4 Update: "We will continue to work in partnerships to serve the needs of the community with relevant purpose and meaningful action" is Goal #4. Activities related to 11 specific objectives focusing on refugee/asylum seeker support, Connections Shelter, community needs assessment, Lincoln Park neighborhood participation, community use of BLC facilities, the REACH, tax preparation services, blood drives, and Wednesday night suppers were reviewed.

Youth Activities: BLC youth participated in 6-church Winter Warm Up event. WOW Zone laser tag event held with plans for Maverick hockey game on 12/9. Efforts continue to involve more young adults in activities. First "Brave Conversation" planned for  $5^{\text{th}}-8^{\text{th}}$  grade youth to focus on mental health with outside speaker.

Community: New ministerial association being organized with Mankato churches to share resources and work together to address community needs.

New BLC Members: Tanya Mallen and her children Rose and George approved for reinstatement as BLC members.

Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, December 19.








