<u>Update on Strategic Planning Process</u>

Thank you for your input! In the listening sessions, as well as in the Day of Remembering, we have heard your vision of where God is calling Bethlehem in our future. The Task Force has taken your input and formulated preliminary goals. The list of goals will grow in the next few months, until the council and task force meet to consider which goals to prioritize and pursue over the next four years. The goals will be presented to the congregation for final approval.

The list of goals so far:

Strengths to build on

- 1. Integrate children, youth, and family program into the life of the congregation.
- 2. Continue to encourage people to be generous in time, talents, and treasures.
- 3. Develop a plan to make personal connections to encourage members to complete the annual Time & Talent survey, and to better utilize the collected information.

Dysfunction in our congregational life that needs to be fixed

- 1. Create opportunities for meaningful and respectful conversations.
- 2. More effectively use and enhance the Bethlehem Lutheran Church conflict resolution policy and process and promote its use by members and staff.

Mission to our community (outreach)

- 1. Conduct a yearly assessment of community needs in conjunction with community partners.
- 2. Partner with community agencies to meet the needs of our community.
- 3. Identify, prioritize, and implement a strategy of community and global engagement.

Aspirations for the next four years

- 1. Call, empower, and support the new Associate Pastor.
- 2. Intentionally identify, empower, and support lay leadership and provide mentors when appropriate.
- 3. Eliminate the mortgage.
- 4. Become a more diverse congregation.

In March, the task force will interview key leaders in greater Mankato, asking what are the most important needs in our community, and how a church like Bethlehem can help meet those needs.

But before that, you are invited to a Day of Norms. Norms are the unwritten rules that every congregation lives by. Monthly Mission NOTES FROM COMMUNITY & GLOBAL MISSIONS BOARD

Our February 2022 mission is **Partners for Housing.** P4H believes it is essential that affordable housing and temporary shelter be available to those in need. The public interest is best served when all citizens have the opportunity to properly house themselves and their families in comfort and safety, and the cost of housing should not disproportionately deplete the already stretched finances of the poor and homeless. Deep-rooted in the community for over 30 years, Partners for Housing is seasoned in serving the housing needs for vulnerable populations. The organization owns and operates a number of site housing facilities that provide different housing options. In addition to their emergency shelters — Theresa House, Union Street Place, and Welcome Inn — they provide transitional and permanent affordable housing options to homeless and/ or at-risk individuals and families in the Mankato area.

Council Corner

Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **January 18**. Meeting minutes with details are posted at www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Financial Report: December 31 general fund balance to end the fiscal year was a **positive** \$2,000+ pending final adjustments. Healthy generosity resulted in a major improvement over the 11/30 **deficit** of **-\$12,256**.

Flags in the Sanctuary Conversation: Join us on Sunday, January 23 at 10:15 a.m. for a congregational conversation on the appropriate role of placement of flags in our sanctuary. Rachel Maccabee, Gustavus Adolphus Counseling Center staff member with expertise in mediation and facilitation, will guide the conversation. Come, listen and be heard!

<u>Day of Norms</u>: The strategic planning process continues with this event on **February 6** at 4-6 p.m. Join other members to help identify what norms and values underlie decision making and activities at Bethlehem. Appetizers and socializing will be offered prior to the conversation. Help to shape the goals of the new 5-year strategic plan with your reflections.

<u>Call Committee</u>: The draft of the Ministry Site Profile will be shared with the congregation at a 10:45 forum on February 20. This is an essential step in the call process in identifying who we are as a church for the synod and candidates for our associate pastor position. You can also contribute your pastoral priorities by completing a survey during this forum.

Family Faith Formation Director Sabbatical Leave: The first-ever sabbatical leave for our FFF director was approved on the recommendation of the Personnel Committee. Anna Wencl plans to rest, travel, and recharge during the 6 weeks from April 11-May 23. A plan is being developed with the pastors, Children's & Youth Boards, and other BLC staff to cover her responsibilities during this time.

<u>Lay Staff Compensation Framework</u>: The BLC Personnel Committee will initiate a lengthy study of compensation resources to develop a framework for salaries & benefits for our lay staff.

LSS Meals on Wheels: LSS has contacted Bethlehem about serving as a future site for meal preparation and packaging. The Council expressed interest in this new partnership and will pursue further discussions to identify operating details before a final commitment is made.

Building Safety Protocols: Mankato public safety representatives will be invited to meet with BLC leadership to review and update our facility safety protocols.


