Gathered Into One-Lent 2024

Loving our neighbors is an essential part of our Christian faith. Here at Bethlehem we know that well and we live it well. What happens, though, when we face divisions and disagreements? How do we love our neighbors in the times when it is really hard? How do we love our neighbors for exactly who they are—honoring the diversity among us and allowing our neighbors to be exactly who they are?

These are just some of the things that the Letter of 1 Corinthians talks about. Paul wrote this letter to the churches of Corinth when he heard about division and strife among them. Many of the same struggles of these early churches are struggles that we still face now. Paul's words are just as relevant now as they were when he wrote them.

That is why for Lent this year we will be taking a deep dive into this scripture text in our Lenten series *Gathered into One*. For the six weeks of Lent, we will be hearing from different preachers from other Mankato area churches as we all take a look at different parts of the letter of 1 Corinthians. Pastor Jay and I will both also be participating in this, too, so we may be gone visiting these other churches a few of the weeks of Lent. I am excited for this opportunity to hear many different voices on this important piece of scripture and what it can say to us today. I hope you are excited, too, as we reflect on this together with our fellow Lutheran congregations.

So join us as we delve deeper into what loving our neighbor really means and what building Beloved Community that honors and respects diversity is all about. Let's see what scripture has to teach us about how to be a community in the face of division. I hope you'll join us! ~ Pastor Jacie



Council Corner Highlights from the Monthly Council Meeting



Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on January 16. Official minutes with more details are posted at www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Finances: December 31 financial reports not completed & available. November 30 budget deficit of -\$47,270.50 reduced to approximately -\$17,000 with BLC member contributions. Thank you!! Major progress made on mortgage funding with balance owed now under \$600,000. Additional funding is in hand to reduce balance to \$500,000 at end of January.

Endowment Board Update: Chuck Piehl, board chair, presented background on board members; founding resolution; fund growth (\$1,453,214.68 current balance); current diversified investment strategies; 2023 grants to 15 church, community, national and global groups totaling \$22,575; scholarship program totaling 330 granted over 33+ years and current board budget. BLC member and professional investment counselor David Morgan acknowledged for guidance on investments.

Stewardship: Fall pledge campaign report finalized: 165 pledges made for 2024. We have \$13,046 and 3.64% more in total dollars & percentage pledged compared to 2023 pledges. Reminder cards mailed to 153 members in December with no additional pledges received. Some BLC members provide financial support annually but do not actually pledge a specific commitment.

Strategic Goal #1 Update: Engaging Youth: "We will implement creative & effective ways to better engage post-confirmation youth and their families and young adults." Additional progress made on 10 specific objectives since last Council update in August reviewed by pastors.

Earned Sick and Safe Time (ESST): Council approved BLC Personnel Committee proposals to update BLC pastoral & lay staff sick and family leave to comply with the new 1/1/24 state law.

Synod Meetings: MN River Conference annual meeting to be held on February 18 at Grace Lutheran in Waseca for Council members. SE MN Synod Assembly to be held on May 11 in Mankato. BLC members interested in serving as delegates should contact Bob Ihrig by January 31.

Fat Tuesday Contribution: Council members approved voluntary donations to fund a basket in support of BLC youth fundraiser on February 13. Thrivent action grant of \$250 approved to cover event expenses.

New Mankato Ministerial Association: Held 1st meeting in January with 5 pastors in attendance. Listening session planned with city manager on January 30 regarding new Mankato strategic plan.

Lent: BLC will share Lent worship with 3 area churches. Noon worship to be added for Ash Wednesday & Good Friday.

Youth/Young Adults: 8 BLC youth planning to attend summer ELCA national youth gathering. Conversations held with REACH staff about how to connect with community young adults.

Crossroads Campus Ministry: New campus pastor, Jenna Couch, to be installed on February 18 with SE MN Synod bishop.

WELCOME Update: Coordinating team to meet to update operations to provide appropriate support of Cruz family. Travel by family to Wisconsin held to connect with relatives.

Welcome & Inclusion: RIC Sunday scheduled for January 28 with worship service & adult forum. Congregational art project planned for January. Get your BLC T-shirts to wear on the 28th.

2024-25 Nominations: Nominating process starting to update memberships of BLC Council & boards/committees. Council positions include: Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer & Member-at-Large. Board/committee chairs to be contacted to identify new members & vacancies to be filled.

Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, February 20.

ECHO Food Shelf is our February monthly mission partner. They have been committed to addressing food food shelf insecurity in our community since 1981. ECHO provides Blue Earth

County and North Mankato residents with monthly and weekly food orders, home deliveries for those without transportation, a summer feeding program for school-aged children, Thanksgiving baskets, and daily food for the unhoused. Eligibility is self-declared; no one is turned away. The program is supported by grants and donations (food and monetary) as well as food rescue from local grocery stores and restaurants. Our February donations will be presented in March, which is Minnesota Food Share Month, doubling what we give. This program depends on dedicated volunteers—we encourage you to give of your time as well as financially!
