# Monthly Mission NOTES FROM COMMUNITY & GLOBAL MISSIONS BOARD

Help us support individuals and families experiencing homelessness by donating to Bethlehem's March monthly mission -- Connections. Connections extends a welcome that provides dignity, shelter, and community to those with a need. Connections shelter is a low-barrier emergency shelter. They house men, women, and families and have a 35-bed capacity. The shelter is open from 6 p.m.-8 a.m. daily; intake is from 6-6:30 p.m. A meal is served nightly. Many volunteer opportunities are also offered, so consider offering your time as well as giving monetarily. Our goal is \$3,000.

The Call Committee met on 2/10 to work on the first draft of our Ministry Site Profile (MSP). We hosted the Adult Forum on 2/20 and provided insight into the call process, our progress, and what to expect in the near

future. We also conducted a short survey to those in attendance; the survey will also be decimated to the congregation through all of our various church communications so that everyone has a chance to participate. Our next meeting date is March 6. The Call Committee has a mailbox in the church office, and we encourage all who have questions or concerns to reach out to us.

#### Endowment Board Update

Soon the Endowment Board will be accepting scholarship applications from high school seniors and college students working on their undergraduate degrees. **Applications will be due <u>by May 1</u>** again this year. Watch for announcements.

The Bethlehem Endowment Fund started in 1983. It is a fund separate from all other congregation funds. Through the years, many people have contributed legacy gifts, memorial money, and donations. Because the principal has grown and is not spent, the interest income has also increased. Following the Fund's own bylaws, the Endowment Board determines where to share that growth income. Many charitable organizations, mission projects, and college students have received help from the Endowment Fund.


# Council Corner

Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **February 15.** Meeting minutes with details are posted at <a href="https://www.blcmankato.org">www.blcmankato.org</a> and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Financial Report: December 31 general fund balance to end the fiscal year was confirmed at a positive \$2,180.70. January 31 balance still being finalized. Flags in the Sanctuary Conversation: Discussion held on issues and opinions shared at 1/16 adult forum. Decision tabled to 3/15 Council meeting for more discussion of possible options and involvement of full Council membership. Stay tuned! BLC COVID Plan Update: No changes planned in mask requirement due to continued area high rate of transmissions. CDC recommends continued mask wearing in this situation. Ash Wednesday procedures to return to normal. No communion changes planned at this time. LSS Lease Renewal: Current 10-year lease expires August 31. Given pandemic impact leading to limited use of all office space, LSS has requested a renewed lease for one year to consider future needs. Council approved this request with intent for further discussion with LSS at start of 2023 regarding long-term plans. Personnel: Personnel Committee discussing development of lay staff compensation model. **Synod Assembly:** Saturday, May 7 assembly to be held in Mankato at Mayo Civic Center. BLC entitled to 3 delegates. Contact Bob Ihrig if interested in attending. Marian Mallory & Bob have communicated interest. Council to confirm in March. Synod also requires local volunteers to facilitate assembly activities. Contact Emily in office for 40 Together Synod Lenten details. We need YOU! Initiative: Council approved \$1,500 from undesignated memorials to support synod Lenten initiative for global ministries in Colombia, Mexico, & Tanzania. Lenten & Easter Services: BLC will collaborate with other local congregations to share pastors for Wednesday services focusing on Sabbath theme. Plans for 1 Easter service. Call Committee: Progress continues in preparing for call of new associate pastor this summer. Site profile being completed. Adult forum scheduled on Sunday, February 20 to provide update & complete survey on pastoral priorities. Strategic Planning: Day of Norms event held on 2/6 with feedback. Community leaders being interviewed by Goals being developed for Council review/ recommendation. Capital Campaign: Stewardship Board to interview 2 firms on 2/22 to lead capital campaign. Building Safety Meeting: Mankato public safety representatives will present information & recommendations for enhanced building safety procedures. Meeting scheduled for Wednesday, March 30 from 3-4:30 p.m. Staff, ushers, Council members & interested BLC members invited. Refugee Resettlement: BLC discussing with 3 other local churches collaborative sponsorship of a refugee family. Synod is providing information and advice. New Member: Julie Missal approved as new BLC member. Welcome, Julie! Nominations: Nominations process for Council, board & committee members taking place. Need to fill 24 positions. Contact Bob Ihrig if interested in serving the church. Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, March 15.



#### Pastor Don Roberts served as pastor from 1989-1996. He was diagnosed with ALS in 1995, and continues to be an inspiration of life & faith to our congregation,

Moses' commission to Joshua was to lead the Israelites to the promised land. Moses promised that God would go before Joshua. Moses was right. That is true for us today as well. He is with us no matter what we are going through. He does not practice "social distancing." Henri Nowen said, "Our suffering is God's suffering." God loves us so much that our suffering is his suffering.

God will not forsake us. God did not forsake Joshua and the Israelites. It is the same for us. Sometimes we doubt this. I have had ALS for 27 years. Sometimes I doubt God's faithfulness. We all have life circumstances where we doubt God's faithfulness. Let's go deeper. Jesus died for us, even though he could have avoided it. He loves us so much that he died for us. No matter what we are going through, he promises us a glorious future with him.
