


# The Bethlehem STAR March 2023

Financial Report: Positive January 31 general fund balance of +\$1,278.10 with member giving at 106% of budgeted giving. Mortgage balance reduced to \$860,721.62 as result of an advance payment of \$145,000 made in January from capital campaign donations. Another advance mortgage payment planned in February. Thank you for your generosity!!



A principal payment was made on the mortgage of \$145,000 taking our principal balance down to \$860,722. Another large payment is anticipated for February. Expenses are in line except for snow removal. As we all know, this has been an exceptionally bad winter. Thank you for your continued generosity.
