Council Corner

Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on **April 19**. Meeting minutes with details are posted at www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

<u>Financial Report</u>: March 31 general fund balance finished at -\$4,380.39 compared to positive February balance of +\$601.16. Mortgage principal balance is \$1,116,573.89 with scheduled monthly payments of \$8,187. An additional mortgage principal payment of \$67,462 was made using unpledged mortgage contributions in 2021.

<u>Nominations</u>: Marie Slotemaker approved as new BLC Vice-President & Brad Groth approved as new Facilities Board member. Both stepped up after semi-annual meeting to serve BLC.

<u>Capital Campaign</u>: Positive unanimous support at semiannual meeting acknowledged. Contract signed with GSB to coordinate campaign. Initial fees to be paid using untapped \$15,000 bequest. Council to discuss options for another project of value to be included with campaign.

Flags in the Church: Range of opinions received from BLC members on decision for placement of flags & messaging shared. Positive response to respectful listening process used.

<u>Call Committee</u>: Ministry Site Profile near completion to identify BLC priorities for new associate pastor. Mutual expectations for pastor & BLC reviewed and recommended for committee follow-up. Plan on attending **May 15 Town Hall** after worship service to hear more!

<u>Strategic Planning</u>: 5 strategic goals approved. Implementation actions to be developed.

BLC Semi-Annual Meeting: Positive response to discussion & decisions made. Meaningful discussion held on letter to Council from Welcome & Inclusion Board.

New Members: New BLC members approved.

<u>Wednesday Night Supper</u>: Chef Barry resigning as of May 31. Future food & staffing options for the fall discussed with more Council conversation to be held.

<u>Lutheran Social Service</u>: Waiting for signing of new one-year lease by LSS. LSS Meals & Wheels proposal for BLC kitchen use no longer being considered by LSS.

Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, May 17.




