Confirmation

On May 5, six of our young people will stand before God, their family and friends, and you, their community in Christ, and say, "I believe," and "I promise." We call the rite confirmation, and it's been a part of our Lutheran tradition for a long time. Each of these young people were brought by their parents to the baptismal font (one of them is the first child I baptized at Bethlehem!), and now it's time for them to claim their baptismal faith for themselves.

I have spent the last nine months with them. A few years ago, we rethought what we felt our young people needed in order to have a vibrant faith that connects them to community, and brings hope and life to the world God loves. We settled on the following:


- —They need to know the story of Jesus, and what Jesus means for the world and for them.
- —They need to know what it means to be Lutheran, and our emphasis on grace.
- —They need to know what others believe—both other Christians and other religions.
- —They need to know how to practice their faith and develop a prayer life, participate in a Christian community, serve the needs of our neighbor, and work to make the world more equitable and peaceful.
- —They need to have fun doing this.

Like our confirmation program, our young people are a work in progress. They deserve your prayers and support, and in the confirmation liturgy we will together promise to pray for them and support them. On May 5, we will ask them:

"Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

- —to live among God's faithful people,
- —to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper,
- —to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word & deed,
- —to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- —and to strive for justice and peace in all the world?"

They can't, nor should they even try to, keep their promises without us. ~ *Pr. Jay*





Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on 16. Meeting minutes with details are posted www.blcmankato.org and are also available in the church office notebook. Financial Report: General fund balance changed from February 28 positive \$1,089.29 to negative \$5,251.91 on March 31. March member giving was below budget by \$14,676 while expenses were slightly above budget. March 31 Mortgage Balance: \$480,454.99. Additional principal payment to be made in April. Mission Investment Fund Account Balance: \$114,078.42 (used for monthly mortgage payments of \$8,187). April 21 Semi-Annual Meeting: Quorum of 75 members needed to conduct official business of approval of annual reports and election of new Council/board/committee members. Updates on BLC strategic plan and WELCOME project also to be presented. Meeting to be held at 10:45 a.m. after worship service in the dining room. Coffee, doughnuts, conversation & action to be served. 2024 Ballot: 7 positions remain to be filled on the Council (1), Finance (4), Stewardship (1) & Youth (1) boards. Strategic Plan Update: Positive progress on Goal #4 Community Partnerships: "We will continue to work in partnerships to serve the needs of the community with relevant purpose and meaningful action." was reported with details shared on the 11 supporting objectives and practices. **REACH Expansion Proposal:** Positive response received from the REACH and LSS to BLC financial proposal for expanded space use in BLC Youth Room in REACH lease. **Endowment Contributions**: Endowment Board approved April contributions of \$4,000 to Pr. Kristin Engstrom; \$2,000 to Thee Alliance to Reduce Medical Debt; \$2,000 to WELCOME/Cruz Family and \$5,000 to Campus Cupboard. College scholarship applications being received. Youth/Young Adults: BLC children and youth participated in special Muslim Eid educational event hosted by BLC Family Faith Formation staff. Cruz Family Update: Driver's permit received by Cruz family father with behindthe-wheel instruction being planned. Scholarship approved for family to attend one-week summer camp. Work permit paperwork filed with hopeful approval as well as for pending asylum application. May 8 Wednesday Evening Worship & Outdoor Picnic: Plan on attending the final Wednesday evening worship service and supper this spring on May 8. Special dinner church service being planned. Site and schedule details to be announced. Come one, come all! Synod Assembly: Southeastern MN Synod delegates will gather on Saturday, May 11 at the Mayo Clinic Event Center in Mankato to conduct official synod business. Our 2 pastors, Amy Haigh and Bob Ihrig will represent Bethlehem as official delegates. Other BLC members are welcome to attend & observe proceedings from 9 a.m. -5:30 p.m. Learn about our synod! June 3 Council/Board/ Committee Leadership Orientation: Members of the Council, boards & committees will meet for the annual leadership supper & orientation on the evening of Monday, June 3. Our Mission Partner for May is House of Hope, an **House of Hope** organization which provides outpatient services to adult men and women

substance abuse disorders. This includes a specialized program for people with co-occurring substance abuse and mental health disorders. They are currently in the process of developing enhanced services for the mental health component. The organization has been in Mankato for more than 50 years and previously operated residential treatment programs as well, but it has had a change in focus in the last year. The current program is probably 50-50 men and women, deals most commonly with cross-addiction, has the contract with the Blue Earth County Drug Court, and is compatible with AA and NA approaches but is not limited to those. Contributions will be used for scholarships as well as start-up funding for new programs. Thank you for giving generously to support those among us who struggle with substance use and mental health problems.

Financial Report





At the end of March, the general fund deficit returned. It was at \$5,252. Member giving continues strong year-to-date at 118%, but in March, general fund giving was only 71% of budget. Large expenses included a quarterly insurance payment and some building repairs. No expenses were out of line with the budget.
