Call Process

Bethlehem Lutheran Church, an established, thriving, missionminded RIC congregation in downtown Mankato, Minnesota, seeks effective, caring candidates for full- or part-time Associate Pastor of Word and Sacrament, with special focus on mission, ministry with older youth and young adults, and leadership in social justice, inclusion, and connecting with community. Compensation package is in line with synod guidelines plus a sabbatical plan.

This sounds like a church I want to be part of! Thanks to the call committee, who put together this invitation to our next pastor. I want to update you on the progress of our discernment and preparation in calling our next pastor.

The call committee has been working faithfully over the last several months to put together what is known as a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is a summary document of who we are at this time and shares the gifts and areas of responsibility we imagine our next pastor having to carry out the mission God is putting before us. The MSP was put together with prayer, using the results of our strategic planning process, as well as your input in conversations and surveys. The MSP will "go live" now that it has been completed by the call committee and approved by the council.

That means we are entering a new phase. Pastor Barb Streed from the Office of the Bishop will begin matching candidates that seem like a good fit, and who may be called to be our next pastor. The call committee will interview multiple candidates over the next weeks. They may ask a candidate, or candidates, to return for a second interview. When they have found one they believe God is calling to be our next pastor, they will be introduced to the congregation at a special meeting, where you will vote to determine whether to issue a call. We will receive information about the pastor before the meeting, though specifics — including name and where they are serving — will be withheld to protect their confidentiality and honor their current call.

We are confident, thanks to God's faithfulness and your good work, that Bethlehem is a desirable call for a capable and faithful pastor. We are confident that the Holy Spirit is at work in this process, and thank you for your prayers. This is an exciting time for the church! ~ Pr. Jay

Financial Report: April 30 report not available at meeting due to vacation of financial secretary.

Lutheran Social Service Office Lease: 1-year lease approved effective August 2022. Future discussions to be held regarding LSS long-term facility needs and plans.


From the Call Committee
