Bethlehem has joined the **NicBlueCares Compassionate Community.** NicBlueCares is part of a worldwide movement called Compassionate Communities. Nicollet and Blue Earth County residents are committing to building a safety net of community support and strengthening our compassion and capacity to care for one another in crisis or loss. (You can learn more at <u>nicbluecares.com.</u>) We have joined with other churches and organizations like Mankato Public Safety and MSU Mankato and shared how we serve as part of the compassionate charter. Below is our compassionate charter:

Bethlehem Lutheran is intentional and committed to living out a compassionate presence for our members and for the community.

### Support for those who are grieving:

- —Pastors and the Care Ministry Team visit before, during, and after the death.
- —A prayer shawl is given to the dying and/or grieving.
- —The pastors and staff offer assistance in planning a funeral or memorial service.
- —Pastors offer referrals to grief support groups and resources.
- —Church members who have died are remembered and honored at worship on All Saints Sunday.
- —Gifts of food are informally presented or coordinated by congregation members.

### Support for those who are lonely:

- —Pastors and Care Ministry Team visit, phone, and send written notes.
- —Transportation to worship is provided at no cost.
- —Wednesday night suppers are free & open to congregation members & the community.
- —We offer a variety of small groups at different times.

### **Support for those seeking community:**

- —We are a Reconciling in Christ Congregation, offering an intentional welcome to identities and communities that have not always been welcomed in the church.
- —Greeters welcome members and visitors.
- —We intentionally look for ways to integrate members into small groups for service, fellowship, learning, and fun.
- —We join in the Kato Bells of Belonging, showing our support for and solidarity with those who have experienced loss.

### THE SOUL AS SOIL

Gardeners who've dealt with inhospitable conditions can relate especially well to Jesus' parable of the sower. Drought, invasive critters, and thorny weeds often

seem to conspire against growers' efforts. Yet when seeds fall on "good soil," the crop yield is abundant — up to a hundred times what was sown (Matthew 13:8).

That parable emphasizes the need for hearts to be receptive to God's Word. But it's also a reminder to plant Scripture persistently. Just as soil and weather conditions change, so may someone's attitude toward following Jesus. Pastor J. Ellsworth Kalas writes, "Whenever we serve as witnesses to the faith, we must do so with all earnestness, because one doesn't know the season in which the soul currently abides. That uninterested, distracted, or unresponsive person may be nearer the Kingdom than we — or they — realize." Kalas adds, "We dare not give up on anyone at any time — including ourselves."




### **Hooray for VBS!**

For many churches, vacation Bible school is a summer highlight. The event leads to lasting memories and changed hearts. It also sparks laughter. Maybe

you've seen VBS humor online, such as the quote, "You know you're obsessed with VBS when you're excited about a piece of cardboard on the side of the road."

For hungry young learners, snacks make an especially big impression. One excited preschooler shared that she enjoyed "juice and Billy Graham crackers" at VBS. Another boy raved about the first day, saying, "We heard stories and drew pictures. Then we went out to play, and when we came inside, God had juice and cookies waiting for us!"

Pastor Don Roberts served as pastor from 1989-1996. He was diagnosed with ALS in 1995, and continues to be an inspiration of life & faith to our congregation.



And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you.

And remember, I am with you always to the end of the age.' ~ Matthew 28:18-20

We sometimes doubt Jesus' promise to be all authority on earth. We see wars, disease, and starvation. These are not God's will. In the early days of shipping we had lighthouses. Jesus is our lighthouse in tough times. The light overcomes the darkness. Jesus is indeed the authority on earth.

The risen Christ is giving us a mission statement to make disciples of all nations and baptizing them. He also said to keep his command, which includes loving God with all our hearts, souls, and minds and to love our neighbors as ourselves. We can't love our neighbors unless we love ourselves. Sometimes that gets a little tricky. Jesus loved us so much that he died for us to forgive our sins. If Jesus loved us so much, why can't we love ourselves?

Jesus said he would be with us to the end, to the end of the age. That means he is with us when we fight a disease, when we are in the checkout line, or when we are in stress. The risen Christ is with us always.



We're so grateful for a wonderful week of VBS! Our theme was boundless and our kids and youth discovered all the ways God's love for us is boundless. We're especially grateful to the staff from Green Lake for leading and to all of our awesome volunteers who stepped up to serve dinner, decorate, and fill in when Covid-19 got in the way of our plans.
