At our June all boards, committees, and council meeting, I asked our leadership, "What are you excited about at Bethlehem?"





- —Pastor Jacie's arrival

Notes from the Community & Global Missions Board



Our July mission is **Partners for Housing.** P4H is guiding people on a path toward housing stability. This program works by providing emergency shelters at Theresa House, Union Street Place, and the Welcome Inn. Transitional housing, rapid re-housing, and long-term housing all are part of

their program. They collaborate with many other supportive services.

Homelessness in the Mankato Communities continues to be a big problem:

- —14,000 individuals live at or below the poverty level in Blue Earth and Nicollet Counties.
- —1 in 10 homeless have served in the military.
- —In Mankato, 36% of renters spend more than 50% of their income on housing.
- —Blue Earth and Nicollet Counties rank the worst in the state for cost-burdened renters.

Bethlehem Endowment Scholarship Presentation June 4, 2023

In 1983, Bethlehem Lutheran Church established an Endowment Fund with generous gifts of \$17,000. In 40 years, that Fund has grown to almost \$1.4 million through contributions by individuals given in addition to their support for Bethlehem's operating budget, capital campaign, or monthly mission projects.

The funds donated to the Endowment are not touched, but each year the yield from investing the Fund advances Bethlehem's mission in ways that the regular budget cannot.

Since 1990, the Endowment has provided scholarships to high school graduates and college students who are part of our family here at Bethlehem Lutheran Church. This year, each scholarship is \$600.

As these students pursue their educations into the future, we want them to know that we will pray for them and that they're always welcome at Bethlehem.



Once again, this financial report covers two months, April and May. In April, the general fund deficit grew to \$16,297, and in May, it grew to \$27,923. Member giving is at 96% of budget at the end of May (budget of \$222,200 vs. actual of \$213,206). In early July, mid-year statements will be mailed out. Please review your statement carefully. Pay special attention to pledged amounts for the capital campaign as well as for the general fund. If you are behind on your pledge, and you are able, please catch up. Thank you for your continuous support of the mission and ministry of Bethlehem.
