**Iambi Secondary School (ISS)** is our September monthly mission. The school is a boarding school for both girls and boys. School capacity is about 200 students. ISS has a total of 20 workers (teachers and non-teachers) who cooperatively work together to attain school mission and vision.

Academically, Iambi Secondary School has been doing very well in various exams. In the Mkalama district, it is a leading school, and in the Singida region it is among the top ten schools in regional and national examination results. ISS has a conducive environment for students to learn with a reliable power supply, enough books, and enough teachers for all subjects. They also teach computer studies courses and religion. Gifts from Bethlehem have been transformative for ISS, and our past generosity enabled the school to install electricity, allowing the students and teachers to study and prepare lessons after the sun went down. Test scores soared, and enrollment boomed. Please give prayerfully and financially to our friends at Iambi Secondary School. Our goal is \$7,000.

Calling a New Associate Pastor: The BLC congregation will gather in a special meeting on Sunday, August 21 at 10:45 to review and act upon the call committee recommendation to call a new Associate Pastor. Join us in the Dining Room to learn about the candidate and cast your vote. 75 BLC members needed for a quorum to conduct business. Come one, come all! Financial Report: July 31 balance is -\$28,459.21 compared to June 30 deficit of -\$22,140.60. General fund offerings are significantly below what was pledged and budgeted for the past 3 months. Actual member giving is at 85% of what was budgeted since January 1. Mortgage balance is \$1,043,642 with monthly payments of \$8,187 to cover principal & interest. 2022-23 Council Goals: 7 annual goals approved to focus on support for: 1. Strategic Plan; 2. Capital Campaign & Mortgage Payoff; 3. New Associate Pastor; 4. Zambia Ministry Partnership; 5. Connections Ministry; 6. Welcome & Inclusion; 7. BLC Pastoral & Lay Staff.

Lead Pastor Performance Review: Questions, timeline & process approved for Pr. Jay's annual performance review in August & September. M. Bliesmer, J. Bruns, B. Ihrig to conduct review.

**Capital Campaign: "Imagine...A Vision of Hope"** has been approved as the theme to guide this fall's capital campaign. The 4 teams (Information, Inspiration, Response, Special Events) are making plans for activities for the congregation. Steering committee meets again on 8/18 and teams gather again on 8/24. Line of credit approved by Council to cover campaign expenses.

**<u>RIC Welcome Statement Revision</u>:** Bethlehem RIC Welcome Statement update approved to include these words: "We are a community committed to racial equity and social justice."

Family Faith Formation Sabbatical Policy Revision: Personnel Committee & Council approved revised policy update based upon first sabbatical experience last spring/ summer.

<u>Fall Semi-Annual Meeting</u>: Save the date on Sunday, November 20 for semi-annual meeting.

Next Council Meeting: Tuesday, September 20.



The general fund deficit continues to grow. At the end of July, it had grown to \$28,459. The major cause of this deficit is below budget general fund giving. Year-to-date, giving is \$47,781 below budget. The Finance Committee is looking into this issue. Giving reports were e-mailed in early July. WORDS OF HOPE

Now may the God of peace who brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, make you complete in everything good so that you may do his will, working among us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be the glory forever and ever. ~ Hebrews 13:20, 21



God wants us to have peace. Sometimes that seems difficult. Wars rage across the globe. Wars rage in us. Pray for peace on our planet. Pray for our own problems. We can have peace in our chaotic lives. When peace eludes us, we can find comfort in the words of Jesus in John 16:33: "I have said this to you, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you face persecution. But take courage; I have conquered the world!" We can have peace among the nations. God's will is that there be peace.

The God of peace brought Jesus back from the dead. Without Jesus' resurrection, we die, and that is it. There is no hope and no future apart from the resurrection of Jesus and his promise in John 14 that "I will come again and take you to myself, so that where I am, you may be also."

We are the sheep, and the risen Christ is the shepherd. The good shepherd will not abandon his sheep.

"...Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b) The risen Christ is with us in the hospital and in our jobs. He is with us when we die. He promises to lead us to a better future. Throughout the Bible, forgiveness required the shedding of blood. In the Old Testament, priests were required to kill animals for the forgiveness of the sins of the people. The shedding of Jesus' blood on the cross for the sins of humanity ended the requirement of animal sacrifice. It is an eternal covenant for the forgiveness of sins. We do not have to worry about the future. Jesus has taken care of it. Thanks be to God!
