#### **Donate Stocks or Mutual Funds**

Contributing securities to Bethlehem offers valuable financial and tax benefits:

- •Donors may deduct the entire value of the securities as a charitable donation; and
- •Donors avoid paying capital gains tax on any increased value of the securities.


If you are interested in making an end-of-year gift to Bethlehem via stocks or mutual funds, it is important that you not sell the securities first. Please contact your financial advisor or Bethlehem's office for more information.

#### Charitable IRA Rollover

Many donors have discovered the benefits of making a gift using their Individual Retirement Account (IRA). If you are 70½ or older, you may be interested in this way to make a significant gift while lowering the income and taxes from your IRA withdrawals. Benefits of an IRA charitable rollover:

- •Donors avoid taxes on transfers of up to \$100,000 from your IRA to Bethlehem;
- •Donors satisfy your required minimum distribution (RMD) for the year;
- •The gift reduces the donor's taxable income, even if you do not itemize deductions;
- •A charitable IRA rollover is not subject to the 50% deduction limits on charitable gifts; and

Highlights from the Monthly Council Mtg.



Here are the "highlights" of the Bethlehem Council meeting held on November 15. Meeting minutes with details will be posted at www.blcmankato.org and also are available in the church office notebook. Visit with Council members with questions and concerns! We welcome your conversation & feedback!

Financial Report: Great News! The September 30 deficit of -\$43,247 has been converted to a positive October 31 balance of +\$6,129.45 as a result of generous giving. Mortgage balance is \$1,020,000 with monthly payments of \$8,187 for principal & interest. Members are encouraged to fulfill their 2022 financial commitments to the end of this year to maintain the positive news!

Capital Campaign: Progress continues with 125 donors and \$720,936 committed to paying off the mortgage. 151 pledges totaling \$322,798 have been received to fulfill the 2023 annual fund mission and ministry. We continue to reach out to every member in seeking a commitment to these 2 financial goals. You may complete an online intent card or turn in your card to the office. Save the date on Sunday, December 18 after worship to celebrate our financial campaigns with a reception in Grounds for Joy. The Stewardship Board wishes to thank YOU for your support of Bethlehem. Time for charcuterie treats and conversation with the Bethlehem family.

<u>Financial Review Committee</u>: Mark Larsen appointed to new 3-year term on committee that conducts annual internal review of BLC finances. Thank you Mark for continuing your service! Welcome Pastor Jacie Richmond: Pr. Jacie is meeting

Bethlehem members and orienting to church activities as our new associate pastor. She appreciates the warm welcome from the congregation & staff! Official pastoral installation will be held during worship on Sunday, December 4. A welcome reception will be held in the dining room after worship. Join us! Pastoral Housing Allowances: Specific dollar amounts from annual pastoral salaries were designated toward housing allowances for tax purposes.

Resettling Refugees & Asylum Seekers: Bethlehem continues engagement with area ELCA churches to provide for future financial support of refugees & asylum seekers. Pr. Jacie is representing Bethlehem in meetings with next one scheduled for December 8. BLC Community & Global Mission Board is supportive of this community initiative.

Fall Semi-Annual Meeting: Sunday, November 20 at 10:45 -11:45 a.m. in dining room. A quorum of 75 members is needed. Please attend to allow us to conduct important business!!

## **Financial Report**





There is wonderful news to report. The deficit that had grown to over \$43,000 at the end of September has been erased. At the end of October, the general fund balance rebounded to a positive \$6,129!!! The generosity of the members of Bethlehem never ceases to amaze. General fund giving year-to-date is at 94% of budget, up from 83%. If you have not yet turned in your commitment form for 2023, there is still time. Thank you for your continuing support of the mission and ministry of Bethlehem Lutheran Church.


